Annie attended Mt. Olive Elementary and Junior High School in Garfield, Texas. She attended LC Anderson High School where she graduated in the class of 1956. Annie went on to Nixon Clay where she completed classes in Business.

Annie's preparation began when she accepted Christ as a young girl. She attended Comanche Baptist Church in Garfield, Texas under the leadership of Pastor Rev. J.L Thompson. Annie met and married Lonnie Colson, who adopted Annie's son Homer Earl Colson as his own. Earl came home from Fresno California to care for his mother in her later years. Watching the Dallas Cowgirls, which they fondly called their favorite team was a favorite pastime of theirs while eating a Taco Cabana salad. They never missed a game even during a losing season. Upon surviving a stroke, Earl enlisted the help of his cousins Cheryl and Sammy Reese to assist with his and Annie's care.
