Months later, after giving birth to my son, I began to hemorrhage. I lost so much blood that the hospital staff began to panic and cleared the delivery room. I too began to fret, but then I remembered the words of Mother Hohneke, and I asked they allow my mom to remain and that she pray. Seconds later that hemorrhaging subsided.

Today, my son is extremely healthy, defying every negative word the doctors declared over him, and he plays college football! (This is the last photo I have of my son and Mother; it was taken the summer before his senior year of high school.)

Bless God for His servant, Mother Hohneke! She will definitely be missed.
