He made a guitar out of a cereal box and rubber bands and was excited to play it at church. It was then, 1st Lady Ruth Long bought him his first acoustic guitar, followed by his mom with his first electric guitar. Clint was also known for his love for MC Hammer pants and making Bart Simpson T-Shirts for family and friends. In 1994, Clint moved to Austin TX with mom and siblings where he became a member of Grace Covenant Christian Center under the leadership Bishop Alan Young.

Clint truly was the life of the party. He could imitate almost anyone at the drop of a hat and had a humor that could leave a room in tears from laughter—both intentionally and unintentionally. Fearless, daring, and full of personality, Clint brought energy wherever he went. His laughter, storytelling, and unforgettable sense of humor could be found in every room he entered. Many came to know and love Clint as “Rev. Turner,” a memorable character he portrayed during his acting days in the stage play, Phazes of a Woman’s Soul. Clint also performed with numerous bands and talented musicians throughout Texas, including the group Made Flesh, where he released original songs such as “Jesus the Lover of My Soul,” “Get on Up,” along with several instrumentals. No matter the atmosphere, his frame of mind, or the circumstances surrounding him, Clint never hesitated to speak about the goodness of Jesus. Clint was a man of many talents and passions.
