Dorothy Evelyn Carter Hunter

May 25, 1941 - September 7, 2024

Dorothy Evelyn Carter Hunter, a beloved matriarch and lifelong learner, was born on May 25, 1941, at Holy Cross Hospital in Austin, Texas. She was the youngest of 12 children of Tom and Effie Carter, joining her late siblings: James (Jimmy) Carter I, Tom Carter, Jr., Tommie Mae Crawford, Ella Mae Halt Davis, Addie Lee White, James Carter II, Alf Carter, Billy Eugene Carter, H.C. Carter, Johnnie Mae Scott, and Ruth Bernice Moore.

An exceptional student, Dorothy began her educational journey at Montopolis Elementary School, continued to Kealing Junior High School, and graduated from L.C. Anderson High School in 1958. She earned her Bachelor of Arts and a Master of Science in Education from the University of Texas at Austin. In the early 1970's Austin desegregated its high schools. L.C. Anderson high school was moved to a new location in a different part of town. As a graduate, Dorothy and her classmate Joe Reid were instrumental in forming an association for those who had attended L.C. Anderson. They are the Founders of the "Original L.C. Anderson Alumni Association". The O.L.C.A.A.A. continues today.

A devoted Believer, Dorothy became a member of St. Edwards Baptist Church in Austin at age 12. She is also survived by her nieces: Linda Moore (great-niece Belinda Simpkins and her son Keitren Simpkins), Barbara Moore (great-nephew Keith Moore and his son Dezlon Moore), Mary Etta Bills (great-nieces Kyeshia Carter, Octavia Carter), and her dearest friend Karen McKnight, who stood by her side until the end. Mr. Dorothy devoted her teaching career to Austin Independent School District, where she taught at Johnston, Lanier, and Crockett High Schools from 1973 to 1989. She tutored for many years serving students in both High School and Jr. High School. In 1990, she joined Huston-Tillotson College (now University), where she served as a Mathematics Professor until her retirement in 2005.
