After graduation, Gerald attended College of the Mainland and was later employed at NASA Space Center. Gerald's journey led him to Austin, Texas in 1985. While there, Gerald was employed at the State Comptroller as a System Analyst Manager until his retirement in 2023.

Gerald accepted Christ later in life and was baptized in 1989. Gerald was a passionate believer and would share the gospel with anyone that would listen. Gerald served as teacher, intercessor and mentor in his local church. Gerald accepted the call to ministry in 2016 and was ordained in 2017. In 2019, Gerald followed the leading of the Holy Spirit and with his wife, founded Kingdom Life Center in Austin, Texas. Gerald served faithfully in senior leadership until his health began to fail.
