Henry Harold Aldridge was born October 7, 1947 in Bastrop County; Cedar Creek, Texas to the late Edna B. Hodge and Willie Aldridge. Henry completed his earthly journey on November 24, 2024.

Henry graduated from L.C. Anderson High School in 1965. Shortly after graduating he began working for the City of Austin (Austin Humane Society), followed by the State of Texas (Travis State School), and then with the Austin Independent School District (working at multiple schools within AISD). After twenty-three years of service with AISD, he retired on March 31, 2010.

In 1994, Henry met Ruby Lee Harvey. Henry and Ruby entered into Holy Matrimony in June 1995. Their years together were filled with many memorable and rewarding moments. Moments that may seem simple to others were always very memorable to both of them: going out to eat and/or to the movies, attending social events and family gatherings, and taking leisurely evening walks in their neighborhood. Henry and Ruby enjoyed watching football games, specifically the Texas Longhorns and the Dallas Cowboys. Henry's TV show favorites were: Gunsmoke, Rifleman, and old Westerns.
