Bishop Danny Lamar Berry, known as “Danny” by his family, was born to Eugene Thomas and Laura Berry in Houston, Texas. The name Danny was later omitted after it was discovered during his primary years that it was accidentally left off his birth certificate. He was raised by his mother, along with 13 siblings, and attended Sam Houston High School. On December 12, 1973, Bishop Lamar Berry enlisted in the United States Army as a data communication terminal specialist. In the spring of 1974, he met Mary Linda Darden in Killeen, Texas, and married her on September 12, 1974. Following their union, Bishop Lamar was deployed to Camp Long, Korea, for 13 months and was awarded the National Defense Service Sharpshooter (Rifle) Medal. In October 1975, Bishop Lamar transitioned to the reserves and moved to Austin, Texas, where

he and Linda built a lifetime of memories. After his discharge in 1978, they had four daughters.

Their first daughter was born prematurely and died shortly after birth. Bishop Lamar was the proud father of LaTinysha, LaMencia, and LaFadrian.

Bishop Lamar Berry an accomplished business owner for over twenty-two years. He founded

Berry's Bright Bunch, a licensed registered family home, with his wife Linda. They were childcare

providers and foster parents to hundreds of children. Bishop Lamar participated in a review

committee for Texas Early Childhood through Work Source Solutions and became a professional

master trainer for licensed registered homes.

Bishop Lamar faithfully served within the following congregations: McKinley Heights

C.O.G.I.C (Pastor R.A. Grant), Live Oak of Austin (Superintendent Leroy Darden), and #1 C.O.G.I.C

(Superintendent R. Davis). He was a dedicated deacon for over twenty-seven years, serving on the

usher board, as a Sunday school teacher, on the finance board, maintenance committee, and as his

pastors' adjutant. One of Bishop Lamar's most prized ministries was marriage enrichment, where

he facilitated numerous classes, seminars, conferences, banquets, and cruises.

In 2013, Bishop Lamar answered a call from the Lord to pastor Rivers of Joy Temple of Worship.

On January 20, 2024, he was appointed as Bishop under Bishop L.A.

Wilkerson, Agape Family of

Churches (AFC). He devoted himself to impacting Caldwell County by

spreading the Good News that
Jesus loves.

Bishop Lamar Berry was preceded in death by his mother, Laura Berry; his
father, Eugene

Thomas, Sr.; and siblings, Vennis Dennis, Lloyd Dennis, Paul Berry, Leonard
Berry, Katherine Berry,

Eugene Thomas, Jr., Queen Berry-Thomas, Vanessa "Peaches" Thomas and
Timothy Thomas.

He is survived by his loving wife of over 50 years, Linda Berry, and his
daughters: LaTinysha

Melton (Oscar "Scottie"), LaMencia Hill (Perry Jr.), LaFadrian Dongo
(Valentine "Val"), and godson

Paxton Townsend. He is also dearly missed by his siblings: Marcela Berry,
