Minnie Mae (Hunter) Carrington was born in Bastrop County on August 18, 1935 to Roosevelt

Willis Hunter and Norma Lee (Jones) Hunter. She was the fourth of nine children.

Raised in a Christian home in Webberville, Texas, Minnie accepted Christ at an early age. Her

farm life was shared in a tiny, four- room house with her parents, six sisters, two brothers, and an

occasional relative who stayed for extensive periods. One of her tasks was to walk a quarter mile

to a water well and fill a two-gallon bucket with fresh water. This provided water for her father

when he came home from working in the fields and for cooking. Minnie also provided first-aid

for all who were injured while at home or working the farm. This inspired her to pursue and

become successful in the healthcare profession. Though Minnie was raised in

a musical family,
she was never a singer nor musician; however, she enjoyed babysitting for
them while listening
in on rehearsals and enjoying her many gospel favorites.

Minnie's education began in the Webberville, Texas school system until the
family moved to

Travis County, Austin. Minnie attended Austin Public Schools and a 1955
graduate of Old

Anderson High School. Minnie later united in marriage to Willis D. Neal
(deceased). To this

union, one child was born, Renita Cheryl.

In later years, after returning to Texas, Minnie and her sisters enjoyed
attending church musicals

and revival services. One revival evening, a Marine/Navy serviceman and
gospel singer

happened to be the featured Baptist preacher of the revival. Shortly after,
upon his request, he

was introduced to Minnie Mae, and the rest became history.

In 1962, Minnie united in holy matrimony to the late Reverend W. H.

Carrington of Clarksville,

Texas. To this union, two children were born, Madeline Patrice and Ronald
Gregory. All their

lives the children would only hear their father speak their mother's name as
"Sweet Peaches."

Minnie served as a Pastor's wife for more than 40 yrs. Knowing "Sister
Carrington" is to also

know the scripture Proverbs 31:10-12, "Who can find a virtuous woman? For
her price is far

above rubies. The heart of her husband doth safely trust in her, so that he
shall have no need of

spoil. She will do him good and not evil all the days of her life.

Minnie was a woman of devotion, not praised because she was a giving person nor mathematically gifted or how well she took care of her home, but was praised because she was first devoted to God. All of her virtuous qualities—Rare, Valuable, Trustworthiness, of great Character, Willingness to Serve, Motivated, Diligent, Woman of great Wisdom and Knowledge, Dedicated and beautiful lady, and quiet in spirit—were all founded on her devotion to the Lord, leaving a great impact and life-long impressions on many Ministers' wives and church congregants where she served throughout those years. Not only was she an inspiration to many as a Pastor's wife, Minnie's remarkable contributions to the Healthcare profession came to fruition where she simultaneously served the community as a nurse for 30 years at the Old Seton Hospital, later Seton Medical Center,. She was described as soft-spoken, caring, and unselfishly giving of herself to all patients whom she served until her retirement. Upon her retirement, Minnie's love continued and her heart grew fonder as she cared for her six grandchildren as their parents worked. From infancy to elementary after-school care, she was their "cool" grandma, heroically naming her "MaMaMa." From the oldest to the youngest, she was a proud "MaMaMa" who deeply loved her grands. As they became adults with their own families, her deep love was extended to her great-grands during her health

challenges, each one
sharing her memories in their heart, as “MaMaMa”.

Since Minnie had served others, the time had come for her to be served. Her daily care was shared by Hospice Austin, her son and daughter. The wall of pictures, social-media, special visits by grands, great-grands, family and church friends inspired her each day for five years until the good Lord whispered for her to rest. 2 Timothy 4:7-8, “I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith. Now there is in store for me the crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous Judge, will award to me on that day—and not only to me, but also to all who have longed for his appearing.” The family wishes to thank the Hospice Austin family for your tender care and commitment to your mission.
